UPDATES AND NEW INFORMATION

Temporary cash flow support for not-for-profit organisations

The Australian Taxation Office (ATO) will be providing temporary cash flow support to not-forprofit organisations that employ staff.

There will be two sets of cash flow boosts of between \$20,000 and \$100,000 delivered from 28 April 2020.

They will be provided to eligible businesses, delivered through credits in the activity statements, when businesses lodge their activity statements.

You must lodge your activity statement to receive the cash flow boost. Eligible businesses, including not-for-profit organisations, must have held an ABN on 12 March 2020 and lodge your activity statement to receive the credit. Charities registered with the Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission (ACNC) are eligible, regardless of when they were registered, if they meet the other eligibility requirements.

New travel and movement restrictions in the NT

There are new <u>travel restrictions</u>, <u>border controls</u>, and details regarding classification as <u>essential services</u>.

The most recent set of new rules came into effect at 11:59 pm on Thursday 26 March and relate to non-essential travel into designated areas. People cannot enter designated areas unless they are part of the approved remote essential workers list. New process for ordering Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) for Aged Care and NDIS sectors

Aged care providers that require Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) must now email <u>agedcarecovidppe@health.gov.au</u> for all requests – please don't approach Primary Health Networks.

All requests will be triaged by the Commonwealth Department of Health with priority given to facilities, programs and workers where there has been a confirmed case of COVID-19.

The following information must be provided in your email request:

- the facility, program or service requiring PPE
- if you have had a confirmed case of COVID-19 at your facility, program or service
- types and quantities of PPE required
- details of other suppliers you have attempted to source PPE stock from.

Latest advocacy

The digital divide: NTCOSS joined ACOSS, the Australian Communications Consumer Action Network and others to warn Communications Minister Paul Fletcher that many individuals would face an increased digital divide if they lacked access to digital technology in a time when we're increasingly isolated from face-to-face contact. Community sector support: NTCOSS, ACOSS and the other COSSes around the country wrote to the newly-established National Cabinet. We drew attention to the size of the community sector in Australia (250,000 people employed and an \$11 billion contribution to the economy) and outlined our recommendations on key issues. Issues raised included addressing the remaining gaps in the safety net, extending business stimulus measures to the not-for-profit sector and creating maximum flexibility for contract arrangements on not-for-profits. <u>RESOURCES</u>: Return to Country and new restrictions regarding re-entry

The Australian Government is working in close collaboration with State and Territory Governments to help save Australian lives by stopping the spread of COVID-19. Following agreement from the National Cabinet, the movement into certain remote areas is being restricted to protect some of our most vulnerable Australians.

From 11:59pm Thursday **26 March**, anyone wishing to enter designated areas will need to selfisolate for 14 days before they can enter. This is a requirement that will be made by the Minister for Health under the Commonwealth's Biosecurity Act 2015 and includes residents of communities in these areas. The areas where restrictions apply will be communicated by the State and Territory Governments prior to commencement. Governments will support people who do not have appropriate alternate arrangements to self-isolate.

There will be exemptions to the travel restrictions for people entering to supply and deliver essential services and Governments are working hard to make sure these essential services and supplies will continue to remote areas.

People already in remote communities should stay there unless it is essential to leave for medical treatment.

Not-for-profits – Stimulus measures from NT Government and Federal Government

NT Government Stimulus: \$5 million for not-for-profit and community orgs

The Northern Territory Government has announced a round of stimulus measures today as part of its \$65 million Jobs Rescue & Recovery Plan. Read the full <u>media release</u> here.

Not-for-profit organisations will be eligible for a payment of up to \$100,000 linked to the tax they withhold from their employee's salary and wages, with a minimum payment of \$20,000. We have been advised that this payment will arrive automatically if your not-for-profit meets the eligibility criteria.
